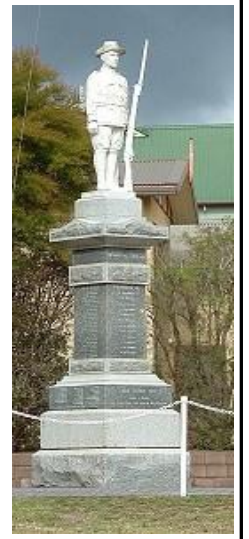


In 1986, a young woman with two blond, curly-haired little girls, took over as “Post Mistress” in the old Clarence Town Post Office building. “Post Mistress” she used to say, “I’ m nobody’ s mistress!” The job then was from 9am to 5pm and closed for 1 hour for lunch.

At the end of June 2022, Helena Morris will retire from the Post Office/Shop to pursue other activities, including travelling with husband Alwyn. The elder of those curly-haired little girls, Dannielle, will then become our new Post Office Licensee and that will be a blessing for the town because Dannielle has the same work ethics as her Mum.

What a life of service to Clarence Town, Helena has provided over that time, some 36 years. During that time, Helena has seen a lot of changes in Clarence Town. She was a natural.

Nothing was ever a bother. She would do what-ever was necessary to help everyone. When she became the PM, there was no town mail delivery, so everyone had to come to the Post Office to collect their mail and buy all their postal requirements. There were deliveries out of town though - every day around Glen Martin and Glen William, and twice a week out at the Woerdens Road area.

In 1992 Helena moved from the old Post Office building to a little room in the little grocery store at 47 Grey Street. Oddly, she and Alwyn used to live in the premises there previously, for a time.

In 1993 Australia Post decided to provide an in-town delivery, so everyone rushed out to buy a letterbox. Helena was very concerned about this delivery because it meant that people would not be coming to the Post Office to collect their mail and so may purchase their stamps and other postal products when shopping out-of-town, as people mostly travelled to Maitland and Raymond Terrace to do their shopping. She need not have worried. Everyone still come to her Post Office to buy their postal needs, for which she continues to be very thankful to the town for their continued support. She loved it, and still does. That welcoming smile and willing heart endeared her to everyone. After a little while, Australia Post moved from being manual accounting, to computers, so another way of accounting had to be learned. Again, Helena was a natural, and mastered that process quite easily.

Another huge step for her was to purchase the premises in Prince Street (where the Post Shop is now). In 2004, she opened her new Post Shop, and she could indulge another passion - shopping! Because she had so much more room, she went on a spending spree and filled the shop with beautiful gifts, postal needs, toys, books and much much more.



It was in 2004 that she applied to open on Saturday mornings as well This coincided with the Newcastle Permanent coming to town and it was opened on a Saturday morning. Helena became the manager of the “Perm” as part of the Progress Association, which established the Rural Transaction Centre with a government grant, in 2004 and who purchased 2 shops alongside the Post Office. Helena was responsible for the running, not just of her own business, but the “Perm” as well, hiring staff and arranging for them to be trained in the ‘banking business’ . She held this position for some 9 years, until the ‘Perm’ pulled out!

In 2018 Helena was honoured with the Dungog Shire Citizen of the Year Award for her services to her community. A well-deserved award. Overall those 36 years, Helena has been one of our town’ s greatest assets. No-one will every really know all the little kindnesses she extended to people - the lengths she would go, to make sure mail is delivered (no matter how scant the name and address was, and there were some doozies). She has been passionate about her work and has been in no rush to let go. A more loyal friend you will not find.

We love you Helena and we wish you and Alwyn good health and many happy holidays - all so well-deserved.

There are many ways our community can continue to support the Post Office. One in particular, is paying our bills there and doing banking. It is so easy now to pay everything online, but each time we do that, we take business away from our Post Office as they receive a commission on transactions done over the counter. If your bill has a Post BillPay barcode, please consider paying it in person at the Post Office and not online. Actually, when you think about it, we can do most things, and get most things in Clarence Town (except fuel – and it is coming!) so please support local businesses wherever possible, it will help our town thrive!

Are Australians a faithless lot? I don't think so. I notice the heartfelt reactions to the situation in Ukraine. The heartfelt reaction to mass shootings in the U.S.A., and other places in our world. The God-part of us cries out in pain, and deep feeling for those killed, maimed or mourning. These "heart reactions" indicate to me that we understand that things are not meant to be that way. That there is a greater good somewhere.

Some will say that those tragedies indicate that God is not there, that evil dominates. Perhaps an understandable comment?? But then I look at the hero-stories that abound in these situations, the God-inspired responses. For example, Anthony Borges used his body to hold a classroom door closed during a Florida school shooting protecting 20 other students inside as the gunman fired through the door.

The other side of the story often gives us an insight into faithful, caring and courageous actions. I can't help but think of the courage of Ukrainians in the face of powerful, murderous bullies. The scene of a priest celebrating Holy Communion in the ruins is a powerful image for me. A faithful people to be sure.

Love one another, said Jesus, as I have loved you. Hymns often lead us right back to the basic teaching of Jesus, and a hymn by Bob Dufford S.J. says it all for me....

The Museum continues to be supported by the community via more BBQ's, and constant visitors. There was even a new family to town who visited recently when the museum wasn't open as such but the windy weather had necessitated a clean-up and the Museum looked open. Indeed it was: the front door had blown open for almost 24 hours, but nothing was missing. We are an honest lot here in Claro!

Mr Ford's book about the history of Clarence Town and environs continues to be a best-seller. The amount of information it contains is extraordinary, particularly when we consider his research pre-dated electronic means and the Australian invention of the internet, or at least wifi. That new family to town bought a copy. Many of the items you can see in the Museum are from the late Mr Ford, and his family. He was a great supporter by word, by deed, by donation.

The late Ian Lyall, also a Past President of the Association, was working on an update, so to speak, but died before its completion. Council Report



Why Potholes?

There are many reasons why Dungog Council is unable to maintain its roads network to the satisfaction of the community, but incompetence is not one of them. Many of our sealed roads have exceeded their useful life of approx. 30 years and require excessive and uneconomic levels of maintenance.

Accordingly, has a Roads Maintenance Strategy to optimize the expenditure of available funding. Extract: "Dungog Shire Council owns and maintains in excess of 700 km of public roads... Clearly it is not possible for Council to maintain all of this road network".

At the May ordinary meeting, in response to the ongoing wet conditions Council allocated \$250,000 from the timber bridge maintenance budget (2021-22) to help address the growing list of road repairs and safety concerns until 30th June 2022. While this was absolutely necessary, filling potholes is an expensive operation. This funding could have resealed a 5km length of road to prevent potholes forming. The Dungog Shire 2022-23 Budget includes \$737,000 for resealing almost 14 KM of bitumen roads. The breakdown is 5KM Regional, 7KM local rural and 2KM of urban roads, which is less than 50% of what is required.

We have 458 KM total length of sealed roads comprising 123 KM Regional, local rural 293 KM and urban 42KM which should all be resealed at least twice during their useful life. Sadly, much of the network has deteriorated beyond the point where resealing is feasible.

At a cost of about \$1,500,000 per KM Council cannot afford to rehabilitate the sealed network in a timely manner so potholes are inevitable. The Commonwealth and State governments have provided millions in special grants and we are most grateful, but when all these newly built roads need to be resealed after 10 or 12 years, the money will not be there and so they will deteriorate faster than they should. Special grants cannot be obtained for maintenance.

Banfield Bridge.

Tenders have been called for the replacement of this bridge with works scheduled to begin later this year. The new structure will be a bit higher but it will still flood at times. It is one of 23 timber bridges in Dungog Shire being replaced with a grant of \$16.4 million under the NSW Government's Fixing Country Bridges program. The cost of each bridge had to be quoted separately and if a final cost is less, we return the excess and if it's more Council has to pay. It is unreasonable that we cannot transfer excess funds between projects. There is so much work around for contractors in NSW that prices are increasing. This also applies to roadworks and is compounded by materials shortages of gravel, lime and concrete pipes.

Roadworks.

Council has commenced Initial preparations for rehabilitation of Queen Street between Grey Street & Rifle Street, and Duke Street between Rifle Street & Durham Street. Total cost \$1,141,050.

10 STEPS TO BECOMING A VOLUNTEER JOINING A RURAL FIRE BRIGADE



STEP 1 GET STARTED

There are a surprising number of roles available. First, consider the kind of volunteer work you would like to do, and the time you can spare. You need to be a team player. It's also a good idea to discuss your intention to volunteer with your family, and employer – their support can be crucial.

Not everyone wants to go to a fire so some of your options would be Communications Brigade (manning the Radios) – Support Brigade, Catering Brigade – just ask, there will be something for you.

Step 2 CONTACT YOUR LOCAL VOLUNTEER RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

The next step is to contact your local rural fire brigade. The members of the brigade are all volunteers and can help you decide whether volunteering is right for you. If you're not sure where the brigade is located, ask your nearest Fire Control Centre or email

volunteer@rfs.nsw.gov.au.

For anyone in the Dungog Shire your **Control Centre** can be contacted on **4015 0000**. Anyone in the Clarence Town area can contact the **CT Brigade 4996 4454**

STEP 3 THE APPLICATION

Complete the Volunteer Membership Application Form. If you are over 16 you will also be asked to complete a National Police Checking Service Consent Form and provide identification. The Brigade will point you in the right direction.

STEP 4 THE INTERVIEW

You will be invited to attend an interview with the brigade you are seeking to join. The interview will cover the types of things you can expect as a volunteer, what your role in the brigade will involve and what the NSW RFS expects from its members.

STEP 5 PROBATIONARY MEMBERSHIP

If both you and the brigade wish to proceed, your application will be sent to the District Manager for endorsement. At that point you become a "probationary member pending clearance"

STEP 6 CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK

It is important for the NSW RFS to make an assessment about each applicant's suitability for membership because our volunteers hold a position of trust within the community, so a criminal history check will be conducted after your application form is endorsed. Your privacy will be protected in this process.

STEP 7 COMMENCE INDUCTION

While you wait for clearance, you can commence some activities with the brigade under supervision. During this time there are some restrictions on the types of activities you can participate in.

STEP 8 OUTCOME OF APPLICATION

If your application for membership is successful, you will receive a letter containing your membership number. You can now participate in more activities as a volunteer member of your brigade.

STEP 9 TRAINING FOR YOUR ROLE

The NSW RFS provides training opportunities to all members free of charge, giving you the knowledge and skills to work safely in your chosen role. Once trained, you will be provided with the appropriate clothing and equipment for your role.

STEP 10 ORDINARY MEMBERSHIP

You will remain a probationary member for a minimum of six months, and at the end of the probationary period your brigade will vote on whether to accept you as an ordinary member.

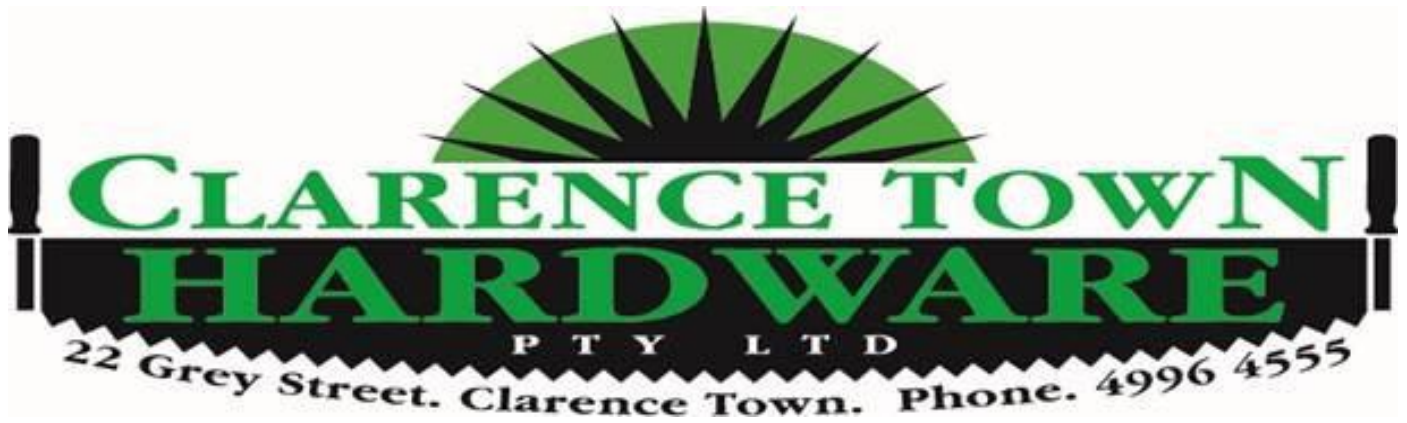
