



From the Parson's Pen

I'm writing this on Easter Day when, in our services, we have re-lived the Resurrection of Christ after the reflective penitence of Lent and the horror of Good Friday.

My thoughts have turned again to a book I read years ago: I cannot remember the title or the author's name, but one feature has stuck with me over the years. In it we are asked to think of Christ as, tradition says, he went to minister to the dead who awaited His coming. He encounters Judas who, you will remember, hanged himself in remorse when he saw the outcome of his betrayal. Judas has confessed his remorse to Jesus, saying that "I thought that you were the one who was to liberate us, and I hoped that this would precipitate things", and Jesus patiently and gently takes him through the explanation of what his ministry was about and why: he concludes by taking Judas by the hand, saying "Come, let us begin again."

Easter is a time of new beginning. What God in Christ is offering us is not simply a slate washed clean of individual guilt, at which we are pretty good, but rather a radical new beginning not just of individual affairs but of our whole being as humans living in the midst of God's Creation of which we are designed to be stewards rather than proprietors.

As a community of Christians we can spend so much time considering our own faults, or being obsessed with the perceived faults of others to the extent that we are blinded to our own shortcomings and glaring wrongdoing, that we fail to see or to appreciate where we corporately fall short of absolute perfection. Our media constantly tells us that "you deserve this" or "you have earned this" as they try to sell us ever more expensive goods which will be destined for the scrapheap when something even more exciting comes along. Our politicians tell us that our economy is "the envy of the world" when it is actually in a very fragile state. We want our living standards to be continually on the increase, even though we are blinded to the injustice and deprivation meted out not only to the marginalised and deprived in our society but to those beyond our borders whose lives and very existence are threatened by our excessive consumption.

When we stand in Church to say the creed, we say "We believe....", as a corporate expression of our faith. We go on in the service to make a statement which is perhaps the most radical thing which we will say together as a family of faith: "We are the Body of Christ: his Spirit is with us" and we then turn to share the Peace with those around us. We are called to live in community, not simply as a collection of individuals.

It high time that we started to LIVE as a COMMUNITY of people, not as single congregations or denominations of Christians of various colours, but across our boundaries of race, nationality and political allegiance. The very future of humanity, and of this planet, is totally dependent upon us living with responsibility one with another.

Some will say "God will provide". God is, at this very moment, providing: we have been endowed with creativity and intelligence. What we are presently lacking the is will to work together for the restoration of God's Creation.

This Easter-tide, my prayer is that we will be sufficiently stirred up to do something about it. Jesus, as in the first part of this essay, is offering his hand to us and saying "Come, let us begin again."





Council Report

2022 Floods and Potholes.

Dungog Shire suffered widespread infrastructure damage in the recent floods and the recovery has delayed scheduled works by about 4 weeks. As the event was declared a "natural disaster" repairing the damage was jointly funded by the Commonwealth and State governments. Newer built roads were generally free of potholes but older sections suffered badly because we cannot afford to reseal them regularly to prevent water ingress weakening the road base. Staff would much prefer to carry out preventative maintenance than responding after the event with expensive stop gap measures.

Flood Issues.

We often hear that a particular flood was "a 1 in 100 year flood", or more aptly the "100 year ARI" (Average Recurrence Interval) which indicates the probability of a certain flow occurring in a river. But this does not mean that flood would only occur once every 100 years.

While it has a 1 in 100 chance of occurring in any one year, it has a 1 in 10 chance of occurring in a 10 year period, a 1 in 4 chance in 30 years and a 1 in 2 chance over 70 years. Compare this with the 1 in 45 million chance of winning Lotto!

The 100 year flood is not twice the size of the 50 year flood, just as the 500 year flood is not five times the size of the 100 year flood. The rainfall of any particular ARI value results in catchment specific stream flows and flood levels.

In March 2022 during a 500 year ARI rainfall event, Lismore experienced its highest flood since white settlement by a whopping 2 metres. Four weeks later another flood of 100 year ARI intensity reached levels similar to 10 major floods dating back to 1870.

The 2022 Hawkesbury River flooding at Windsor was by far not the highest on record. The flood of 1867 was 7 metres higher, and if that flood occurred today, 90,000 people would need to evacuate and 12,000 homes would be flooded.

A "floodplain" is defined as land that is likely to be inundated by the largest flood that could conceivably occur in a particular catchment i.e. the Probable Maximum Flood (PMF). Compared with the 2022 flood levels, the PMF for Lismore would be another 2 metres higher, and the PMF at Windsor would be 13 metres higher. As few catchments have experienced a PMF since 1788, our experience with Australian weather is merely a small sample of its climate. The local Aboriginal name for Lismore means "swampland".

Historical factors have resulted in too many homes being built on floodplains. The NSW Government has co funded numerous catchment specific flood studies that determine flood levels for rainfall events up to and including the PMF. These are Council documents with comprehensive maps showing the extent of the flooding and measures recommended to reduce risk.. The default flood planning level for NSW is the 100 year ARI plus a half metre freeboard, which is a compromise to balance the risk of flooding and minimizing loss of life with building costs. This works well in most locations, but not necessarily on a floodplain where other measures apply i.e. levees.

Clarence Town Floods:

The Clarence Town District has experienced many major floods in living memory but most homes are located well away from watercourses. The Williams River Flood Study 2009 covered the floodplain from Raymond Terrace to 5 KM north of Dungog https://www.portstephens.nsw.gov.au/trim/other? RecordNumber=PSC2009-01574%2F035. The Clarence Town Flood Study 2009 https://www.dungog.nsw.gov.au/clarence-town-flood-study-final-report examined the impacts in the urban area where back flooding from the river extends along town creek as far as the IGA before the influence of local storm water from town creeks takes over.

The 2007 flood was a 100 year ARI event with two commercial properties being inundated. The PMF would typically be 1 metre higher than 2007 affecting 5 houses and 9 commercial properties.

GET DOWN LOW AND GO GO GO? This is not just for the kids!

And have they been told why they have to do this? {because smoke rises}

o Does everyone know that when they are down low and crawl to the door, they must feel the door with the **back of their hand** for heat? If the door is hot, there is fire on the other side. **DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR** if it is hot. If you burn the back of their hand you can still use the palm of the hand to open doors and windows.

o Have you made up an **ESCAPE PLAN** with the whole family Have two ways out of each room. Do not smash the window-open it to avoid cuts. Hang a copy of the plan on the fridge so visitors can see it.

Close doors behind you as you are leaving the house, this will slow the spread of fire between rooms.

o Have you chosen a **MEETING PLACE** outside for everyone to go to?

o Have you **PRACTICED** the **ESCAPE PLAN** with the whole family?

DO NOT GO BACK INSIDE FOR ANYTHING!!!

- o Does everyone in the home know how to **RING 000**? {call it **triple zero** when instructing kids, due to text messaging some think 0 is the letter O}
- o Does everyone know how to **STOP, DROP and ROLL** if their clothing is on fire?
- o Have you checked **ELECTRIC BLANKETS** for damaged or frayed cords and wires?

You can do this by holding it up to the light.

- o Do you keep **HEATERS AND CANDLES** away from curtains and bedding? Never leave either unattended!
- o Have FLUES and CHIMNEYS been cleaned for heaters?
- o Do you have a SCREEN in front of your open fire?

Make sure ashes from your heater are totally extinguished before emptying them in the yard.

o Do you dry clothes in front of the heater? Don't do it!
If you must, keep them at least 'a meter from the heater' and never leave them unattended.

Clean lint from **DRYERS** every time you use them! Have a **FIRE EXTINGUISHER and FIRE BLANKET** located near the exit in the kitchen.

DO NOT hang them near the stove.

DO NOT leave the house with **APPLIANCES** still turned on. e.g. T.V., Computer, Dryer etc.

Install a smoke alarm outside of each sleeping area and one inside the bedroom if the door is closed during the night. Don't forget to install one in your caravan.






