

# 'Starry Starry Night Street Party' is the theme and it will be located all along Dowling Street Dungog on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

Start time is 4pm and will continue on into the night with our "after 5" venues. Late night shopping will be available until 7pm, with the after 5 venues hosting (more) food and music afterwards.

Focus of this event is to encourage shopping local and a cultural celebration of all that Dungog has to offer in the lead up to Christmas. The entertainment and fun will be a drawcard for both locals and visitors to join in the shopping, the entertainment and the fun as we celebrate a 'Starry Starry Night'.

We have been very fortunate to receive some funding for the event following the grant funding secured by Dungog Shire Council, and we are very appreciative of Council's support.

This funding means that we have the ability to pay for exciting and varied activities and entertainment in the street, creating a party atmosphere for shoppers, families and visitors.

Chamber have organised the entertainment and activities and are all free!

We have a small and enthusiastic group organising the event, and they have come up with abundant creative ideas which they are currently finalising. We have a range of entertainment and activities planned, happening the length of the CBD – this ensures inclusiveness as well as space and diversity.

As at today we have secured a selection of entertainment and activities for all ages, including but not limited to; Educational Venomous Snake display by John and Tina Mostyn, who are providing three shows with education and a hands-on experience. Whip cracking legend Andrew Thomas to demonstrate this age old art of Whip-Cracking, jumping castles at each end of the street, face painting by well-known artists and maybe even a mystery celebrity! The food and wine tasting fair, and a range of musical performances including buskers as well entertainment provided by Performing Arts Dungog. 

### From the Parson's Pen

As we age it can be fascinating to look back to see how much has changed around us over the years. While we might be surprised at how much has changed, we might also be saddened at how little has changed.

Sometimes it will be when we are visiting a different culture that we are presented with a different way of looking at things; Christmas being an example.

Two stories. Bougainville 1998 and Baghdad 2007.

### Bougainville.

At Christmas time an army band came to visit. Together with the Command a programme had been worked out. One item in the programme was a Christmas Eve concert to be held in the main town. I tried to advise them that this was inappropriate as it clashed with the main Christmas Eve Mass. They didn't listen.

The concert contained some familiar carols but most of the music was of the more commercial kind that you'd hear in a shopping centre.

Over the following weeks locals asked what the concert was really about;

- 1. Why was it timed to clash with the main Christmas Mass?
- 2. Inappropriate music; 'White Christmas', 'Jingle Bells', Santa Claus'. Xmas Puddings.
- 3. No mention of God, Jesus, messages of Hope, Love, Salvation, Forgiveness.

The Bougainville people are deeply religious and they had just had 10 years of civil war.

### Baghdad

A meeting was called to plan our contingent's Christmas celebrations. The convenor opened an input session on what ideas people might have and then asked for volunteers to take responsibilities for those activities. As the meeting was wrapping up a person indicated they had a

As the meeting was wrapping up a person indicated they had a question. "Ask" they were told.

Question. "What is the Padre doing at this meeting?" "What is he doing in this preparation for Christmas?"

The result was (at first), stunned silence. Then, before I could say anything, everyone else jumped in to tell them that, "... without the Padre there to talk about God's love, Jesus being born, salvation, there wouldn't be any Christmas"

So, how is Christmas looking for you? Just a holiday or really a Holy Day?

### **Council Report**

Draft Upper Hunter Regional Transport Plan



"An integrated network – that embraces the 15-minute neighbourhood planning principle where people regularly choose to walk, cycle or take public transport to shops, services, schools or work."

"Upgraded Newcastle Airport, improved road networks and public transport services as well as integrated walking and cycling connections allowing visitors to easily explore the region."

Council will continue concentrating on "improved road networks" and "walk, cycle or take public transport" as we have a long way to go (pun intended):

Dungog Shire has 122 KM of Regional Roads that until 1995 were classified as Main Roads & fully maintained by the NSW Government. They were given to us without a <u>funding source</u> to look after them, so for 27 years this has diverted \$ away from local roads. We are the worst affected council area in NSW. The NSW Government has promised to take them back. Announcement is pending.

### Also:

Dungog Shire officially states that it does not have the \$ to properly maintain its 700KM+ roads network. When you see our wealthy neighbours struggling too it indicates that we all need a fairer slice of Commonwealth funding. In 1995 Councils shared 1% of taxation revenue, it is now half that, and since 2022 we have lost out on \$ millions.

### Rural Lands Strategy

Council has struggled with staffing issues during 2022, which have delayed the public exhibition of the Draft Rural Lands Strategy until early next year. During the exhibition period we will hold public information sessions and ratepayers will be able to have individual meetings with staff concerning the possible implications for their property. These aspects will be very important because the Rural Strategy will form the basis of the new LEP and it will be very difficult to address unwanted outcomes after its adoption.

### Banfield Bridge

For several years the Banfield Bridge has been weight limited to 10 tonnes, which accommodated school buses, but this was reduced to only 5 tonnes in early September after a heavy vehicle of 42 tonnes GVM damaged the main beams. Staff estimated a likely cost of \$50,000 to repair the bridge, but this was not pursued because the construction of the replacement bridge is scheduled for late November. The new bridge will be about half a metre higher than the present deck level.

### **NSW Government Community Infrastructure Grants**

The NSW Government Community Infrastructure Grant scheme to be announced shortly has allocated Dungog Shire Council over \$900,000 for projects. Most of this funding will be used to top dress the Clarence Town Rugby/Cricket and Soccer Ovals which will hopefully address drainage issues and the uneven nature of the Rugby/Cricket oval. This will not address the slope of the main ground, but it should allow matches to proceed sooner after heavy rain.

# New South Wales Rural Fire Service



#### INFORMATION FOR RURAL LANDHOLDERS AND FARMERS

Pease do not let the wet weather give you a false sense of security. Brigades have been to numerous fires already so you do need to prepare your property whether it be a Farm, Acreage or a house block.

If you live on a rural property/Acreage, there are simple tasks you need to complete to prepare your property for fire.

A well-prepared property can:

Be easier for you or firefighters to defend.

Give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you cannot leave.

Reduce the possibility of a fire spreading onto your property. Increase protection for valuable assets, such as stock, crops, infrastructure and machinery.

### TOP 5 ACTIONS TO MAKE YOUR PROPERTY

- CLEAR/SLASH: Clear flammable materials (e.g. gas cylinders) and slash areas of long, dry grass around structures like the home and sheds.
- 2. BURN: If you have the required permit / approval and training, conduct a controlled burn on your property to reduce fuel.
- PLOUGH: Plough firebreaks around each paddock boundary to prevent the spread of fire.
- 4. ROTATE: Rotate stock across the property to ensure paddocks are well grazed

PREPARE: Prepare and maintain sturdy hoses and water pumps in case you need to defend your property.

### MORE PERMANENT PROTECTION FOR YOUR PROPERTY

- 1. Prepare a property map and action plan.
- Clean and maintain machinery such as tractors, slashers, harvesters, welders, chainsaws and grinders.
- 3. Fit an approved spark arrestor.
- Carry a working water fire extinguisher (minimum 9L liquid or 0.9kg dry powder) or knapsack (minimum 16L)
- 5. Prepare a safer location for livestock
- 6. Remove overhanging branches from power lines
- 7. Ensure that a fire truck can safely access your property
- 8. Place water pipes from dams underground and install a pump to the house
- 9. Make sure hoses have spray nozzles attached

Keep water tanks full and connected to pumps

### A WORD FROM THE CLARENCE TOWN RURAL FIRE BRIGADE:

The Bush Fire Danger Period commenced on the  $1^{\rm st}$  October 2022 and runs through to  $30^{\rm th}$  April 2023. Permits are required to light a fire during this period. Contact your local RFS Brigade.

Owner/Occupiers are reminded that pile burns can only contain vegetation from your property. **It is illegal to burn household or building waste**. These must be disposed of through Council services or facilities. The following links to Dungog and Port Stephens Councils spells out their burning policies.

https://www.portstephens.nsw.gov.au/services/community-safety (you need to scroll right down to the bottom for this link). Property owners should be aware that the continual heavy rains have made access by RFS vehicles to agricultural land problematic. If you are planning to burn, make sure you have prepared the site and assets are in place to contain your fire within the prescribed area.

Despite the saturated ground, cured grass burns easily and fire spreads quickly. The owner could be legally liable for damage to neighbouring properties.

The new Fire Danger Rating system is in place and a new sign is installed at the southern entrance to Clarence Town near Cemetery Road. For more information on the new simplified ratings visit the New South Wales RFS website.

### Clarence Town Preschool

As we move through the final term of our year, many of our children are starting their transition to primary school. Our local schools work hard to create a welcoming space for the transitioning children that helps to create a sense of belonging. The move from pre school (or any education and care setting) to school can be both exciting and scary. Traditionally, adults have talked with children about going to "big school". For some

children, the idea of this big place can be very daunting. Big school, big kids, big playground... before long, this new place can start to seem very, very big! At preschool we talk about "primary school". We talk about the similarities that the children may see, and the aspects that will be different.

Being *ready for school* is a much talked about topic. We have heard of companies that try to convince families that their preschool-aged children need to attend lessons to teach them readiness skills. But when you think about the school day, what are the things that will really make a difference to a child's experience? At preschool we focus on self-help skills: identifying and being responsible for your own belongings; recognising your body's needs and independently taking care of these (e.g. removing and replacing jackets, using the toilet); being able to ask for assistance if you need it; interacting safely with others and with equipment; positively and mindfully regulating emotions and reactions. We work alongside our children to support them to have self-confidence and to see themselves as strong and capable learners.

Academic development occurs naturally within our program and is, of course, an important part of our curriculum, but this is not the most vital aspect of the kindergarten experience.

We welcome you to visit our preschool and talk about the ways that readiness for school are supported through preschool experiences. To all of the families that have children making the next step in their education we wish you well and hope that this time is special for you,




