

From the Parson's Pen

Recently I was asked what the best part of being a priest is. And I answered pretty quicky: Pastoral and Spiritual Care.

Now maybe you were expecting me to write The Bible, or the Holy Communion or making disciples. Believe me friends, all of these things are extremely close seconds. But being able to be fully present to another person as they wrestle with the meaning of life, or face a hard situation, or have big and difficult questions about God, or even to share in the joys of their lives; that is where the real joy of ministry lies for me.

Pastoral and Spiritual care considers the other as fully formed, loved and held by the infinite Other, that is, God. It allows me to see the person, not the illness, not the shame, not the religion, not the past, but the person uniquely made in the image of God.

One of the things we as humans are terrible at is listening. And believe me, I used to be really terrible at it too. It's not our fault. We live in a really loud world that is constantly vying for our attention. It pulls us in all sorts of directions and almost puts a type of static in our brains that we can't hear beyond. Pastoral and Spiritual care teaches us to place that static to the side and be fully present; to listen for feelings, to let the silence speak, to allow the other person to simply be held in safety and security while they explore the longings of their heart. And really, that is what we do with God in prayer.

God certainly answers our prayers but he is not listening to answer right away often. He listens to our heart. Our feelings aren't silly to him. And this is what pastoral and spiritual care seeks to do. We don't listen to fix, we don't listen to shame, or listen to have an answer. We listen because this other person matters, deeply and profoundly to God.

I wonder if you have considered that you matter deeply to God?

And because you matter to God, you matter, deeply, to me.

Please be in touch if I can be someone who can listen to what life is like for you at the moment. It would be my profound joy to listen to you and share your burdens and joys, whatever they may be.



Council Report

NSW Local Government Recovery Grant.

Dungog Shire received \$1 million from the NSW Government's Local Government Recovery Grants for



severe weather and flooding. Council allocated \$200,000 to finish the sports ground car park off Queen Street and \$20,000 to repair the footpaths and walkways at the Village Green damaged by the 2022 flooding.

2022-23 Scheduled Works.

In 2022-23, due to numerous special grants Council has an infrastructure Budget of \$42 million for roads & bridges instead of the more typical \$5 million. It will be a challenge to deliver every project because of many factors beyond Council's control.

There are State wide shortages of lime, gravel and concrete pipes, so works must be scheduled around availability of materials! And due to Council staff vacancies, contractors are employed wherever possible. Australia currently has a shortfall of 70,000 civil engineers Another factor affecting our delivery program is that with so much civil engineering and construction work available in NSW, prices are increasing. This is problematic for quotes given by staff in seeking the special grants. Besides taking measures to contain costs and streamline tendering processes, Council has made representations to the NSW Government accordingly.

Clarence Town Bridge.

Preliminary site investigations are proceeding on schedule. Heritage NSW has approved the concept design of the new bridge, which will be 20 metres upstream and two metres higher than the old one. Before construction starts, Council needs to secure numerous approvals and access licences etc.

At the August ordinary meeting in a 2D part resolution, Council authorized the General Manager to proceed with numerous land acquisitions/ approvals, gazettal of roads and negotiations regarding three Aboriginal land claims on affected Crown Land.

Thalaba Bridge.

Works have commenced for the \$1.9 million replacement of Thalaba Bridge. Alison Road will be closed to traffic from Clarence Town Road to Pine Brush Road. Banfield Bridge replacement will begin in November.

Planning & Environment.

Mr. Trevor Ryan, Council's new Director of Planning & Environment is recruiting people to fill vacant roles in his Department that have affected various town planning issues and delayed the public exhibition of the Draft Rural Lands Strategy (RLS) leading to a new Local Environment Plan (LEP).

Public Exhibition.

The Draft 2022-2026 Dungog Shire Economic Development Plan was placed on public exhibition for 28 days. This document contains much information about the Shire and outlines initiatives to strengthen our economy into the future. The draft is displayed on council's website.





YOU SHOULD BE PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR THE FIRE SEASON NOW.

Wait until the fire is on top of you and you may die. In case of big fires there will not be enough trucks and Fire Fighters to protect everyone so you need to learn how to look after yourself for a period of time until help arrives. Look at your local town....How many properties? What is the population? How many <u>ACTIVE</u> Fire fighters – *mid week, maybe 4 or 5 if you're lucky*? How many trucks – *maybe 1 or 2*?

What are the chances of a Big Red Fire Truck turning up at your place when the big one hits...Very slim! Remember that all Fire Fighters in the RFS are Volunteers and may be out of town at work during the week when the big one hits so the odds drop dramatically of help arriving quickly if everyone is under threat so please prepare yourself and your property.

Here are a few things you need to start now. PREPARE.

You must make important decisions before the fire season starts.

You are at risk from bush fires if you live or work near bushland, grassland, scrub, or farmland. A fire can be terrifying, with strong winds, intense heat and flames, and thick smoke.

- Don't make rushed and dangerous decisions.
- Prepare your **Bush Fire Survival Plan**.
- Relocate aged, young and sick family members early from areas likely to be impacted by fires.

Leaving early is the safest option. Where will you go? Your **well-prepared home** will increase the safety of fire fighters and is more likely to survive a bush fire even if you leave early.

Make sure you have an Asset Protection Zone which is a cleared area around your structures, this will help protect your home and give the Fire Fighters a safer place to fight the fire from.

Get rid of leaves and branches, move wood piles away from the house or any other structure, prepare your emergency kits and tools you will need to fight a fire.

In case of fire will you leave or will you stay and defend, if staying, who will stay, where will you go if you are leaving early, lots of decisions to make to keep your family safe.

The actions we take and the decisions that we make affect us locally and globally. Each step we take to live sustainably and in harmony with nature and our community provides a positive step for our world.






