CTPA welcomes its new executive committee with the addition of Cheryl Telfer. Cheryl has been a member for 6 years.

#### Village Green

The swing set with the shade covering has been completed with the valuable contribution of time and effort of Steve Low in assisting CTPA. Amenities block and lighting have also been completed thanks to Dungog Shire Council (DSC). CTPA are working with DSC to apply for grants for exercise equipment. CPTA are having plans updated for the village green and wharf reserve, these updated plans will allow for future concepts development and will be used for applying for future grants.

#### **Footpaths**

In conjunction with DSC, CTPA are funding footpaths from the School of Arts to the Bowling Club, past the Senior Citizens, DSC is going to upgrade the curb and drainage at the same time.

#### **Playing Field**

Stockpiles of soil has been placed at the top of Rifle Street for the future development of a sporting field on the quarry site. There is no set time to start the work, when the sports field is constructed, it will provide a full-size playing field.

#### **Walking and Bike Trails**

The concept plan, for the future, will include walking and mountain bike trails linking the Village Green, Wharf Reserve to Columbey and Wallaroo National Parks.

Other long-term projects will also be included into the concept plans for the next 20 years.





Members of the Museum were gratified to be offered a tour of one



of Clarence Town's most imposing houses when the new owners of Hollydene recently opened their doors to us. For those members present, this was a new and wonderful experience. The two-story house dating to the 1880's, the sympathetic additions by previous owners, and the grounds were equally stunning. Samuel Walters, the first owner of the house, had used much local material in its construction-especially cedar, pine, and redwood. Samuel Walters became the largest landowner of the eastern side of Clarence Town in the 1840's and continued to buy and sell land and businesses and so involve himself in the growing township of the 1850's and 1860's.

Some members of the museum were able to help the Wallarobba Hall committee after they had requested any available help for their Octoberfest Day by attending that event on Saturday, 30th September. This involved helping in preparation of lunch and serving at the bar throughout the afternoon. Several people commented how good it was to see one volunteer organization be involved with and connect to a different volunteer organization in our shire

Several members attended the recent launch by Wayne Patfield (from Paterson Courthouse Museum) of his latest book "Morpeth's Steam Ships 1831-1946". He is currently writing his next book on the ships of the William's River.

#### **Council Report**

Clarence Town Bridge.

Dr. David Gillespie MP has confirmed that the original \$8.8 million in Commonwealth funding is still available, but that the Federal Government would not provide funding towards the additional \$4.86 million required to commence further work on the bridge. Council will have another meeting with the Hon. Jenny Aitchison, NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads to pursue the extra funding. It's apparent that it will have to come from the State Government because Dungog Shire cannot afford it from own-source revenue. Meanwhile the construction cost can increase the longer it takes to secure the funding.

#### **Bushfire Season**

Weather variability is a feature of the Australian climate and the Australian bush has always burned long before human settlement. Eucalypts drop their leaves up to eight times per year and in recent years the undergrowth has produced substantial fuel loads.

In Dungog Shire several bushfires have already kept our volunteer firefighters busy and they have also attended fires in other areas. Most of these recent fires have escaped from hazard reduction burning.

Despite the best efforts of the RFS, if a bushfire starts near you they might already be fully engaged elsewhere. So factor this into your considerations in planning for bushfire protection. The message is simple, examine your situation, prepare your property and decide what you can or should do if threatened by bushfire.

Newer residents may not be aware of all this. Most people are familiar with the excellent "Fires Near Me" app on the RFS website, but that website offers a wealth of other useful information for those with a house situated near bushland.

Asset Protection Zone (APZ) An APZ is the most fundamental requirement and everybody should know what they require in that regard. The website tool can advise you on exactly what your specific location requires to establish adequate separation from the fire front.

Ember attack can affect people living in town too because the wind can carry embers many KM ahead of a fire.

The 10/50 Vegetation Clearing Scheme. Vegetation clearing provisions under this scheme allow people with homes situated in a '10/50 vegetation clearing entitlement area' to clear certain vegetation near their homes. Check the online tool to confirm your eligibility and make sure you adhere to the strict requirements and limitations of this scheme.

Rural boundary clearing tool. This allows landholders to clear vegetation along their boundary fences. Mapping in the Boundary Clearing Tool identifies if your landholding is eligible. Strict conditions apply.



#### **FIRE DANGER RATINGS**

Knowing the Fire Danger Rating may save your life.

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The fire danger ratings have four levels which are:

#### **MODERATE**

Plan and Prepare Most fires can be controlled Stay up to date and be ready to act if there is a fire.

#### HIGH

Be ready to act Fires can be dangerous

There's a heightened risk. Be alert for fires in your area. Decide what you will do if a fire starts. If a fire starts, your life and property may be at risk. The safest option is to avoid bush fire risk areas.

#### **EXTREME**

Take action now to protect your life and property Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. These are dangerous fire conditions. Check your bush fire plan and that your property is fire ready. If a fire starts, take immediate action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, go to a safer location well before the fire impacts. Reconsider travel through bush fire risk areas.

#### **CATASTROPHIC**

For your survival, leave bush fire risk areas. If a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Your life may depend on the decisions you make, even before there is a fire. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions. You may not be able to leave and help may not be available.

**NO RATING:** On days when there's minimal risk, the white bar meaning 'No Rating' will be used Report any fires to 000.

**KNOW THE BUSH FIRE ALERT LEVELS** Where there is a risk from bush fire, Bush Fire Alerts provide information to affected communities using radio, television, the internet or telephones. The alert will give information about the severity of the fire, its location and what you should do. There are three Bush Fire Alert levels to help you make the right choices for your safety.

#### **ADVICE**

A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.

#### **WATCH AND ACT**

There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action to protect you and your family.

#### **EMERGENCY WARNING**

An Emergency Warning is the highest level of Bush Fire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk

#### MY BACK-UP PLAN

Mobile phones, home phone and internet can all fail during fires. NBN connected equipment may not work during a power blackout. Don't rely on technology. Always have a back-up to stay connected.

Have an allocate notebook and keep your emergency plan details in it, such as: LOCAL RADIO - My local emergency broadcaster frequency:

CONNECT WITH NEÍGHBOURS - My neighbour names and numbers:




