

Clarence Town Courthouse Museum

Discover the Rich Tapestry of Clarence Town's Past

Situated on the corner of Grey and Prince Streets, the Courthouse Museum reflects a rich history dating back to the establishment of Clarence Town (originally titled 'Erringhi') in 1826 as a timber cutting hub on the Williams River.

The Town Courthouse erected in 1869 served its legal purpose until approx 1970. After years of dormancy, a bi-centenary initiative in 1986 restored the courthouse.


Now a heritage-listed property, the museum, managed by a passionate not-for-profit historical society, preserves the town's legacy. Donations for its upkeep are welcomed, emphasizing the community's dedication to maintaining and sharing the fascinating history of Clarence Town and its surroundings. Fire Safety in the Great Outdoors

Many of you will be going on Holidays over the next few weeks and you need to be prepared to keep your family safe.

Before travelling you should check:

- Fire Danger Ratings and Alerts at <u>www.rfs.nsw.</u> <u>gov.au</u> or on the Fires Near Me Smartphone app.
 Weather conditions at <u>www.bom.gov.au</u>
- Caravan has a smoke alarm, fire extinguisher and fire blanket.
- Electrical and gas equipment is secure, fitted, in good working order, and turned off while travelling.
- How you can call for help.
- Survival kit includes a working battery operated radio, protective clothing, woollen blankets and water.
- Let someone know your plans and contact them if the plan changes so they know where you are.
- Secure and prepare your home. Don't put on FB that

you're going away. Tell neighbours you trust. Don't forget plans for your pets and stock.

Don't travel through remote areas on Total Fire Ban days. If the conditions aren't good, DON'T GO!

Setting up your camp fire or BBQ:

Verify if it's a total fire ban day. Keep fires and BBQ's 3 metres away from flammable materials, in a cleared area with wind blowing flames away from tents. Ensure a responsible adult is present, have a water supply and extinguish fires, candles and lanterns before bedtime.

A fire can be terrifying, with strong winds, intense heat, flames, and thick smoke. If you're caught in a fire: Call Triple Zero (000):

Park away from trees, facing the fire. Switch off the engine, turn on headlights and hazards. Close windows and vents. Stay low, cover with a woollen blanket and use a damp cloth over your mouth. Wait until the fire passes, then exit the hot car, move to a safe, burnt area without trees and hydrate.

Safeguarding Your Home Against Snakes


As warmer weather arrives, the increased presence of snakes inside homes or garages becomes a concern. To minimize this risk, consider the following precautions:

Snakes tend to travel along structures like walls and fences, exploring open doors or gaps, so keep doors and windows closed. Install fly screens or gauze doors. Identify and seal any potential entry points by applying weather strips to doors, including those connecting to the garage. Address rodent presence, as snakes may follow their scent trails.

Equip your home with a snakebite first aid kit and learn essential first aid measures.

If a snake is found indoors, ensure safety by relocating pets and people, confining it to a room, and calling a professional snake catcher. Remember, under the Wildlife Act 1975, it is illegal to harm or kill snakes.

Dungog Council Report

Swift Approval for Clarence Town Bridge Amid Rising Costs

As most people would be aware, when the design phase was completed last December, the estimated construction cost had risen by \$4.86 million. Council approached the Commonwealth, but even their original \$8.8 million was included in their review of infrastructure spending.

Council investigated numerous options to contain project costs such as removing a traffic lane or the walkway and substituting other materials such as steel for concrete members etc. The results demonstrated that the best long term option was to continue with the final design.

A few months ago, Senator Deborah O'Neill inspected the site and considered it to be the most worthy project in NSW that was under consideration in the review. Her visit was most helpful as the Commonwealth increased the original commitment by \$781,000 with the expectation that the NSW Government will increase its commitment of \$5.5 million to match the \$9,581,000 from the Commonwealth. Council is awaiting a response from the NSW Government.

We urgently need a favourable decision because further delay will increase costs, and Transport for NSW cannot postpone restoration of the Brig O Johnson indefinitely. They have been most cooperative throughout by delaying those works pending completion of the new bridge.

Dungog Council's Digital Shift for Development Applications

The processes of submitting a DA have changed dramatically since the state government introduced the NSW Planning Portal which is mandatory for councils to use.

The aim is to improve application determination times, increase transparency of the planning system and ensure greater accountability of all stakeholders. Last financial year 253 DA's worth a total of \$56 million were approved in Dungog Shire.

The whole process has gone online and hard copy applications are no longer accepted.

DA's can be submitted using Council's website, which has direct links to the planning portal. Alternatively you can go direct to: <u>pp.planningportal.nsw.gov.au</u> to lodge a DA. There is a kiosk area in council's administration building for town planning staff to assist with using the planning portal, and this free service has been well received.

The portal features a complete range of digital planning information and services, along with mapping and reporting tools. The "Application Tracker" allows you to search and track the real-time status of DA's from lodgement to determination. Under "have your say" you can search for DA's on public exhibition in Dungog Shire. Persons wishing to make a submission concerning a DA must log in and use the planning portal. Council will still write to neighbours when a DA is submitted next door.

Despite the stated intention of reducing determination times for DA's, there is an inherent delay of about 7 days in making the payment before processing begins. And the portal has been troublesome and time consuming for staff compared with the previous system. Council's website is being updated to better align with the new arrangements and explain the operation of the planning portal.


In the New Year, from the pulpit we will be having four guest preachers through January before continuing in our series in Genesis focussing on Joseph - a man after God's own heart.






