## Clarence Town, a Future Growth Zone...

The Hunter Regional Plan has earmarked Clarence Town for future growth!

As a result, The Dungog Shire Council has secured a \$170,000 grant from the NSW Regional Housing Strategic Planning Fund to develop a Structural Plan for Clarence Town and surrounds. This will establish a framework for development, facilitating future growth by identifying residential, retail and employment land development, as well as improving public spaces and transport networks. The plan also seeks to enhance the town centre's accessibility, identity and overall appeal. Council will engage with the

community, businesses, State govn.

and relevant stakeholders, providing opportunities for residents to input and shape the future of the town.

Council also received \$76,000 from the NSW Govn. to conduct a Flood Study review to ensure flooding risk of any future development zone is reduced.

In addition, council has been advocating for better roads & infrastructure, and the NSW Govn. is working towards matching the funding provided by the Federal Govn. so we can proceed with the new Clarence Town Bridge.

## Stay Ahead of the Danger: Fire Safety Tips for Rural Landholders

Please do not let the wet weather give you a false sense of security. Brigades have been to numerous fires already so you do need to prepare your property whether it be a farm, acreage or a house block.

If you live on a rural property/acreage, there are simple tasks you need to complete to prepare your property for fire. A well-prepared property can:

- Be easier for you or firefighters to defend.
- Give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you cannot leave.
- Reduce the possibility of a fire spreading.
- Increase protection for valuable assets, such as stock, crops, infrastructure and machinery.

## TOP 5 ACTIONS TO MAKE YOUR PROPERTY SAFER

- CLEAR/SLASH: Clear flammable materials (e.g. gas cylinders) and slash areas of long, dry grass around structures like the home and sheds.
- 2. <u>BURN:</u> If you have the required permit / approval and training, conduct a controlled burn on your property to reduce fuel.
- 3. <u>PLOUGH</u>: Plough firebreaks around each paddock boundary to prevent the spread of fire.
- 4. <u>ROTATE</u>: Rotate stock across the property to ensure paddocks are well grazed.

PREPARE: Prepare and maintain hoses and water pumps in case you need to defend your property.

## MORE PERMANENT PROTECTION FOR YOUR PROPERTY

- 1. Prepare a property map and action plan.
- 2. Clean and maintain machinery such as tractors, slashers, harvesters, welders and chainsaws.
- 3. Fit an approved spark arrestor.
- Carry a working water fire extinguisher (min. 9L liquid or 0.9kg dry powder) or knapsack (min. 16L).
- 5. Prepare a safer location for livestock.
- 6. Remove overhanging branches from power lines.
- 7. Ensure that a fire truck can access your property.
- 8. Place water pipes from dams underground and install a pump to the house.
- 9. Make sure hoses have spray nozzles attached.
- 10. Keep water tanks full and connected to pumps.

The Bush Fire Danger Period commenced on the 1st October 2023 and runs through to 30th March 2024. **Permits are required to light a fire during this period.** Contact your local Clarence Town RFS Brigade 4996 4454.

Owner/Occupiers are reminded that pile burns can only contain vegetation from your property. It is illegal to burn household or building waste. These must be disposed of through Council services or facilities. 



## **Kicking Off 2024 with Summer Social Exciting Ventures...**


Clarence Town Scouts (Joeys/Cubs/Scouts and Ventures) have returned for the year. We meet every Tuesday at 6:30pm.

# Parvo Virus Outbreak – Protect Your Pets with Vaccinations

There has been a recent outbreak of Parvo Virus in the Metford, Maitland and Raymond Terrace areas. Parvo Virus causes severe bloody diarrhoea in dogs. It is especially dangerous for puppies, but can also affect adult dogs.

People often think their dog is safe from Parvo (as it never leaves the yard or farm), however the virus can survive in grass and soil for over 5 years and can be brought to your property on shoes. If your dog is overdue for a Parvo vaccination, we highly recommend an annual booster.

For puppies, it's recommended they have 3 vaccinations, the 1st at 6 weeks, 2nd at 10 weeks and 3rd at 14 weeks of age. Parvo virus is different to other diarrhoeas, as it's often fatal. Without treatment, the majority of dogs will die. With treatment, there are still many that do not survive. Vaccination is the only way of protecting your dog. Please call us if you would like to discuss further.

**Dungog Council Report** 

## New Clarence Town Bridge and Infrastructure Updates

As previously reported, the Commonwealth Govn. increased its commitment to \$9,581,000 for the new bridge with the expectation that the NSW Government would match it.

This shift from an 80/20 to a 50/50 funding split affects various NSW projects. Minister for Roads, Jenny Aitchison MP, surveyed Dungog Shire's roads, aiming to facilitate tender calls soon.

### **Road Works**

The Duke Street rehabilitation totaled \$863,500. The road's unusual profile near Rifle Street accommodates its significant slope to aid water dispersion. Queen Street's rehabilitation, costing \$766,755 (including \$200,000 from SRV), will commence post-Easter due to

project delays. Grant funding from the Commonwealth's LRCI Program will facilitate footpath construction on Queen Street's eastern side and Durham Street, completing the "School to Pool" project near the Rugby/Cricket oval.

### **Grant Applications Submitted**

The Clarence Town Progress Association has agreed to co fund two grant applications seeking NSW Government funding to install exercise equipment at the Village Green and solar lighting at the Cenotaph. The Clarence Town ANZAC Committee will also contribute towards the lights.

### Review Local Govn. Financial Sustainability

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) will assess local government finances to tackle rising costs and ensure sustainability. They'll engage with councils and the public to produce a report for the Government by mid-2025. Draft review terms are open for public feedback until March 15 at www.haveyoursay. nsw.gov.au/local-government-tor.

# From the Parson's Pen

I read a fascinating article recently in the Myall Coast 'News of the Area'. It was a valid attempt to provide a secular rationale behind what is important and makes us happy in life.

The author included a meme that is quite amusing on a superficial level, but underscores a deeper problem. I reproduce it here, "The next time you dislike your life, remember it's all about perspective. I have a friend who reads two to three books each week, works out twice a day, has no financial worries and has people who want to have sex with him all the time. And yet he constantly complains about how much he hates being in prison."

The author outlines a list of things he is convinced will ensure a happy fulfilled life centred around having friends who are available for us in our time of need. He calls them 'quality friends' – and claims they are the source of a perfect, safe and satisfying life. And yet at the end of the article one can't help feel empty. Why is that?

I'd argue it's because each one of those 'friends with benefits' may or may not be present, which adds to the stress of the situation. What if there's a falling out? Or one of them dies or is no longer on the scene to help? The absence of those friends has the capacity to unhinge the best of us, if that is where all our hope lies.

The article was about as good as it gets – that is, it was all the secular response can hope to achieve. Get friends (doesn't say how) who do stuff for you to make you feel fulfilled. The secular world cannot escape the prison of majoring merely in levels of personal individualistic satisfaction, a predisposition to a consumer mentality so to speak. Like the prisoner in the meme above, secularists are trapped in the limited perspective of the here and now, without true hope for an eternal future.

But there is more to what was presented. Christians are members of a citizenry, who gather together (and this is what the article really misses out on) **to serve others** who are serving us. Our horizontal relationships are a vital manifestation of our vertical relationship with God himself, and our identity, that which makes us who we are, that spiritual connection can never be severed by any means.

Absolutely we miss our Christian friends and grieve when they die, but not like those who have no hope because Jesus died and rose again, and those who have believed will also rise again with him (1 Thessalonians 4:13,14). There is something totally unique, rich and attractive about the Christian community gathering together as his people, not just being served, but serving each other in self sacrificial ways. There is a joy and level of certainty the secular world has a hard time competing with, and from a spiritual and eternal perspective, isn't even in the race.

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all.




