# Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives

NSW legislation states all residential buildings have at least one working smoke alarm per floor and one where people sleep.

Manufacturers advise replacing smoke alarms every 10 years. Residents are being encouraged to replace their older smoke alarms with **photoelectric smoke alarms** - the type now widely recommended by Australian fire services.

#### PHOTOELECTRIC SMOKE ALARMS

Photoelectric smoke alarms 'see' the smoke. They detect visible particles of combustion, eg smouldering cigarette smoke. They respond to a wide range of fires, but they are particularly responsive to smouldering fires and the dense smoke given off by foam filled furnishings or overheated PVC wiring.

#### IONISATION SMOKE ALARMS (What you probably have in your home now)

Ionisation smoke alarms 'feel' the smoke. They detect invisible particles of combustion, eg from cooking toast. They activate more quickly for fast, flaming fires with little visible smoke.

#### ALARMS FOR THE HEARING-IMPAIRED

There are specialised smoke alarms available for people who are Deaf or have a hearing impairment. These have

a flashing strobe light and/or a vibrating pad that can be placed under the pillow which activate when the smoke alarm sounds and are designed to interconnect with conventional audible alarms in different locations within the home. If one of the alarms senses smoke, all alarms will sound, the strobe will flash and the vibrating pad will operate.

We are out of the permit season of course but you will still need to abide by the same rules, you just don't need the permit. You need to comply with the Dungog Council "Clean Air Policy". #### Notify neighbours and the RFS 24 hours before lighting. THIS APPLIES ALL YEAR ROUND – EVEN OUT OF FIRE SEASON

Members of the public can now use their mobile phone or desktop computer to lodge their notifications about planned hazard reductions or burn offs 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify. You can still lodge your notification at 4015 0000 if you are unable to go online.

#### Dungog Council Report

# 2024-25 Operational Plan and Budget

The Budget includes a substantial capital works program of \$37 Million, which is a result of Council's ongoing efforts over the last few years to attract special grant funding.

Although this is an outstanding outcome for our Community, this level of funding cannot be assured into the future. While previous efforts have resulted in many roads being upgraded there is still a substantial backlog of works and projects, including numerous roads that were worn out many years ago.

The general rate revenue for 2024-25 has grown to \$10.8 Million. This includes the 4.5% rate capping allowance, which is not sufficient to cover award wage increases or the increased costs associated with road maintenance.

The budget will have an anticipated deficit of \$450,000 if we are to meet statutory requirements and scheduled works. Although this situation will be addressed through savings during the year, many important projects have already been excluded because of lack of available funds. A major contributory factor is that the Commonwealth Government's financial assistance grants to Local Government have gradually diminished in real value to half of what they were 30 years ago, and much revenue has been lost along the way for local roads in particular.

By comparison, the 2024-25 Commonwealth Budget has an anticipated surplus of \$9,000 Million! Both higher tiers of government are conducting reviews into the financial sustainability of local government and Council has made strong submissions accordingly, but it remains to be seen whether they will take action this time around in the face of obvious shortcomings. Council's budget includes \$6M of initial work for the new Clarence Town Bridge, \$1.5M for works on Glen Martin Rd and \$1.8M for Pinebrush Rd. The Clarence Town Local Structure Plan and Flood Study have been fully funded by Council and the NSW Government.

The ongoing challenge for Council is to cover the increasing cost of normal operations and maintain community infrastructure. We're striving to do more with less and making every effort to secure extra grant funding.



# From the Parson's Pen

I was recently reading an article about the German theologian, Jurgen Moltmann, who died in June at the age of 98. He was probably one of the most influential theologians of the 20th century and wrote profoundly about the nature of humanity and the unceasing love of God. One of his books has the startling title of "The Crucified God".

Moltmann insists that a loving and purposeful God does not create humanity to live as though this life is mere vale of tears and suffering which only serves to prepare us for a better life in the hereafter. Life, he maintains, is to be lived in the best possible and most creative manner, thus reflecting as far as we are capable the glory and love of the One who created it.

It follows that our human duty, apart from our individual responsibility as redeemed people, is to work to make life as joyful and fulfilled as possible for all humanity, whether it is next door or on the other side of the world.

Refugees: are they created in the image of a loving and purposeful God? Yes? People in this nation living with the deprivations of poverty: do they share in our common humanity? Yes? The world in which we live: is our lifestyle contributing to the spoilation of the planet? Is that planet, which we call Earth, created by a loving and purposeful Creator? Yes?

If the answer to any or all of these is "Yes" then what does our human duty call us to do about it?

We are not merely inhabiting this part of Creation as though we are independent of generations to come, and we can't just say that "OK, when we have totally destroyed Earth we'll go and do the same to Mars, or anywhere else. We belong to a community which goes beyond time and space. Our call to live life to the fullest, however and whenever our individual lives end and we come to give an account of ourselves before The Lifegiver , comes with some responsibility.

Christianity calls us to live with such awareness of the grace of God given to us that we take this life seriously and not see it just as a stepping stone to Hereafter.




