From the Editor

Not quite a local... but working on it!

After nearly seven years living first in Clarence Town and now Glen William, I've come to realise two things: one, Dungog Shire is massive – almost nine times the size of Newcastle – and two, no matter how many working bees I turn up to, I won't be considered a true local until I'm at least thirdgeneration (and even then, only maybe).

But here's the thing – I've never felt more at home.

This part of the world continues to surprise me with its beauty, its bush humour, and most of all, its people. From sausage sizzles and trivia nights to roadside chats and last-minute sheep lambing (don't ask), community life here is alive and well – and I've made more friends in seven years than I did in the decade before.

Dungog Shire may only have about 9,000 people – that's just 19% the population of Newcastle – but it stretches across 18 towns and villages. Driving across it can take over an hour, especially if you get stuck behind a tractor/cattle muster or stop to admire the view (both likely).

And while we may not have skyscrapers or beaches, we've got big skies, big hearts, and conversations that last longer than your phone battery.

So whether you've been here for generations or just rolled into town, I hope The Sentinel gives you a sense of the local heartbeat. Because here, it's not about how long you've lived in the shire – it's about how willing you are to show up.

This House of Grief by Helen Garner – Reviewed by Anne Higgins

Was it an accident when three boys drowned in the car their father was driving after it left the road and drove into a dam? He was returning the boys to his estranged wife following a visit to him on Fathers Day.

In this book Helen Garner describes the theatre of the courtroom as people gather to bear witness

to an elusive truth in the story of the murder trial. The House of Grief is a heartbreaking story of a man's facing up the questioning of lawyers and the eventual decision of the jury made of twelve regular human beings. High drama indeed. A must read.

"When I am big" is a picture board book aimed at young children but which can be enjoyed at any age! Illustrated by Kirsten

Irving the story follows a sweet little bunny who is desperate to grow up and do the things their older sister and brother enjoy. 
A Peak into the Past

Over 100 Join Trivia Night Fundraiser




Wow... what a great night! The tennis club held its annual fundraising trivia night on 16 August –probably our biggest and best yet.

Dungog Councillors Report

Dungog Shire Housing and Infrastructure Master Plan

Dungog Shire is at a real turning point. Our towns and villages are growing, new opportunities are on the horizon, and more people than ever are discovering the amazing lifestyle we enjoy here.

To help guide this exciting period of change, Council is developing a long-term strategy to ensure our growth is wellplanned, sustainable, and true to the rural charm that makes our shire so special.

Council obtained a \$1,895,000 grant under the Commonwealth Housing Support Program to develop the Dungog Shire Housing and Infrastructure Master Plan in order to meet Commonwealth guidelines for housing diversity (rural and village living), tourism, community infrastructure, rural lands and agricultural activities, biodiversity and rural character.

We have commenced a comprehensive planning process, which includes the delivery of:

- A Rural Lands Strategy
- A Local Housing Strategy
- An Infrastructure Capacity and Prioritization Plan
- A Dungog Strategic Centre Structure Plan
- A Growth Management Strategy in the form of an updated Local Strategic Planning Statement
- An Executive Summary and Delivery Plan

This will also address the requirements of the Hunter Regional Plan 2041 and state planning dwelling targets.

Extensive community consultation will take place as each plan or strategy is developed and an online Spatial Viewer tool will be available for community members to understand how any proposed changes to planning controls could affect them before submitting comment.

While these documents will set a strategic planning framework (as with the Clarence Town Structure Plan), they do not change planning controls or zoning. Their purpose is to support preparation of a new Local Environmental Plan and Development Contribution Plan.

Prepare Your Home NOW For the Fire Season

Wait until the fire is on top of you and you may die

In case of big fires there will not be enough trucks and Fire Fighters to protect everyone so you need to learn how to look after yourself for a period of time until help arrives.

Look at your local town... How many properties? What is the population? How many <u>ACTIVE</u> Fire fighters - mid week, maybe 4 or 5 if you're lucky? How many trucks - maybe 1 or 2?

What are the chances of a Big Red Fire Truck turning up at your place when the big one hits...Very slim!

Remember that all Fire Fighters in the RFS are Volunteers and may be out of town at work during the week when the big one hits so the odds drop dramatically of help arriving quickly if everyone is under threat so please prepare yourself and your property. It is your responsibility to prepare your property by removing as much fuel as possible. Fuel is anything that will burn e.g. piles leaves, branches etc.

Here are a few things you need to start now.

PREPARE: You must make important decisions

before the fire season starts.

You are at risk from bush fires if you live or work near bushland, grassland, scrub, or farmland. A fire can be terrifying, with strong winds, intense heat and flames, and thick smoke. Don't make rushed and dangerous decisions. Prepare your **Bush Fire Survival Plan.**

- Relocate aged, young and sick family members early from areas likely to be impacted by fires.
- Leaving early is the safest option. Where will you go?
- Your well-prepared home will increase the safety of fire fighters and is more likely to survive even if you leave early.
- Make sure you have an Asset Protection Zone which is a cleared area around your structures, to give the Fire Fighters a safer place to fight the fire from.
- Get rid of leaves and branches, move wood piles away from the house or any other structure, prepare your emergency kits and tools you will need to fight a fire.
- In case of fire will you leave or will you stay and defend, if staying, who will stay, where will you go if you are leaving early, lots of decisions to make to keep your family safe.

YouTube's New Monetization Rules

Effective from July 15, 2025 YouTube will only pay for original content in an effort to encourage higher quality content and to reduce all the AI generated videos.

This will also include all the reaction videos, that just replay other people's content and limiting the earnings of channels that publish mass-produced, repetitive, or low-effort videos. You tube will not take down or ban the videos, but won't pay money or encourage them.

YouTube has outlined two specific rules that explain the kind of content the platform considers unfit for monetisation:

First, content borrowed from other sources must be significantly altered to be considered original.

Second, repetitive content must serve a purpose beyond gaining views. It must be either entertaining or educational.

MyGov Scams Out of Control

myGov-related scams are now so widespread in Australia that Service NSW has reported a surge in people needing help to reclaim their identity.

These scams usually arrive via email or text message, with messages like:

- "You have an unclaimed reward"
- "You're owed a tax refund"
- "You have an unread myGov message"
- "Your emails will stop working unless you confirm your details"

Each one contains a link to a fake website that tricks you into entering your personal information. A common example is a scam email disguised as Telstra, warning that your terms are changing and your email will stop working unless you "confirm" your details. Once you enter your login, the scammers gain access to your Telstra account. They then request a new SIM card, which gives them control of your phone number. With that, they can bypass two-factor authentication and reset passwords for all services.

Why target myGov? Because once inside, scammers can access your medical, driving, and tax records – everything they need to steal your identity and apply for loans or services in your name.

The End of Support for Windows 10

Just a reminder windows 10 support finishes October 14 2025. After this date no more security updates and by January 2026 a lot of programs will not run on windows 10. If your computer is 4 years old or younger it should be possible to upgrade to windows 11. Paying Microsoft to continue support for windows 10 will not make these programs work. If you have not seen us about updating, do it soon.
